“Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you should answer each person.”

Colossians 4:6

Why must our speech *always* contain grace? We show people the life and love of God when we speak to them as God has treated us, not how they treat us. Grace is “unmerited favor,” or better stated, “getting something you do not deserve.”
